#### NARRATIVE

May proved to be a month of many and varied undertakings. It served to bring out the versatility and "civilianlife experience" of the men who make the 284th Engineer Battalion.

The first day of May found the battalion newly located in a woods in the vicinity of Egghausen. B Company was given the maintenance of the MSR from Siegenburg to Pfeffenhausen. C Company took over the MSR from Pfeffenhausen to Landshut. A Company was still attached to the 14th Cavalry Group. Before the day was finished, B Company was in the process of building a Double Single Bailey Bridge, 60 feet long, and a Triple Double Bailey, 150 feet long, at Landshut. One platoon of B Company was sent to assist the 72nd Engineer Light Ponton Company Stockpile Bailey Bridging at Landshut. CCompany was chiefly concerned with the construction of a needed cut-off at the bridge at Landshut. B Company reported that the Double Single Bailey Bridge, which began at 011530 was finished by 011700.

On May 2nd C Company developed a two-way traffic circulation in Landshut to the bridges across the Isar River. Capt. Heubach also placed a guard on a building containing a small fortune in surveying and drafting equipment. Lt. LeClair reported that our battalion would receive all of Group's future major tasks as far as bridge and road work is concerned. Lt. Finger reported that B Company had finished the Triple Double Bailey Bridge at 021830.

May 3d opened with the stamp of approval from the men, for it brought a move to comfortable billets in Landshut. The move was completed by 1800 and the company commanders were notified to prepare for a command inspection of all vehicles, motor driven equipment, clothing, and personal equipment. A Company was relieved of direct support of the 14th Cavalry Group, effective at 030800 and managed to catch up with the battalion in Landshut by 1700. The day ended with the regretful news that Pvt. Quinn had been killed when his jeep overturned. Sgt. Bastress was slightly injured in the same accident.

From May 4th to May 10th, the period of our stay in Landshut, the battalion "survived" the ordeal of reconverting back to "garrison". Close order drill, athletics, and inspections were the order of the day. Our major tasks were mainly concerned with a thorough reconnaissance of industries, warehouses, lumber, yards and stockpiles, as well as the surveying of bridge sites for the construction of fixed bridges.

On May 10th the battalion moved to billets in Nurnberg where the men were smazed at finding water would run at the turn of a faucet, toilets would flush, and electric bulbs would light at the turn of a switch.

May 11th started off the miscollane ing projects of the month. A squad of men under T Sat Worley was OF THE SOUTH AND SCREEN OF LICE at Al dorf to install a 90 KTAB SOMMITTEE 2/

#21 at Langenzenn was initiated by one platoon from each line company. The posting of overpass clearance signs on all Army road nets was begun on this date also.

Sgt. Worley completed the installation of the generator at Altdorf by 121300. Under Major McGrath's supervision, the battalion carried on the patrol and maintenance of ronds in our assigned area. These roads included: N 14, A 3, N 2, N 8, and A 43.

On May 15th B Company began the construction of a road at the Stein Hospital, as well as the construction of a culvert at the PWE Enclosure at Langenzenn. Sgt. Worley's crew was called out again to repair two generators at Altdorf. Successful recons were held during the last few days which resulted in the finding of cobble stone and gravel stockpiles, two D8 tractors, and a carry-all. By noon all the needed work at the PWE Echosure at Langenzenn was completed.

May 16th brought C Company the job of making a detailed report on all the necessary men, tools, equipment, and plans to put Nurnberg Stadium and its utilities in complete repair. C Company was also assigned the work of removing all the metal swastikas from the erect flagpoles sprinkled so generously around the stadium. By this date the whole battalion was enjoying the swimming pool which the men had converted from a large emergency water reservoir. Capt. Henry reported that his men located several teller mines buried in the Stein Hospital work area.

On Mey 17th C Company began the construction of a timber trestle bridge and a PW Enclosure at Roth. At this point the Stein Hospital road was 60% completed, 30% of the swastikas were removed from the Nurnberg Stadium, and 80% of the Army net roads had been posted with overpass clearance signs.

On May 18th B Company completed the road at the Stein Hospital and received orders to have one squad of men install floors and build miscellaneous furniture at the hospital.

B Company began the construction of a DP Enclosure in Nurnberg on May 19th. A recon party found an unlimited supply of 18 inch still "I" beams at Pleinfeld. The Army film "Two Down One to Go" was shown to the battalion at 0900 and 1300. A Company was informed to drop the timber trestle bridge job at Roth and was assigned to the construction of a by-pass and the repair of a one-way bridge at Barns.

May 20th brought A Company the task of constructing a cinder path in a cemetary at Buchenbuhle and the surfacing of 3000 lineal feet of approach road. The deadline for this job was set at May 29 1800 since Memorial Day Services, at which General Patton would attend, were scheduled to be held there.

On May 21st B Company reported that the carpentry work at the Stein Hospital was finished.

At 1930 22 May A Company reported the completion of the by-pass and the bridge at Barns. Military Government requested equipment with which to clean the rubble from the streets of Nurnberg. Major McGrath offered to take over the street cleaning job if the civilians would patch the roads in our area. An agreement was made

and B Company, with three bulldozers and eight trucks, was assigned the street cleaning task.

B Company reported the completion of the DP Enclosure in Nurnberg at 231700.

On May 24th, S-2 began a reconnaissance of all existing installations within our area that are useable or readilyadaptable as general depots, warehouses, vehicle parks or similar storage purposes. Only those installations providing greater than 10,000 sq. ft. of covered storage or 100,000 sq. ft. of open storage were to be reported.

Prisoners of War were used in our major tasks whenever possible. We could order any number we needed as long as our order was in by 1700 the day previous. Our experience with these men found them good and apparently, willing workers.

On May 25th Group requested that a demolitions man be sent to Military Government to blow several German safes. Sgt. Harmon, who was sent, insisted that he had  $\underline{no}$  civilian life experience at  $\underline{this}$  job.

On May 26th we received the task of building four railroad spurs, with a total of 27,000 feet of rail, at a supply point in Nurnberg. This job was turned over to A Company. Major McGrath estimated the date of completion as July 17 1800.

C Company was assigned the job of repairing the Nurnberg Stadium, as per plan and estimates turned in previously, on May 29th. C Company also was to place a guard on Congress Hall. A Company received two new tasks on this date, the guarding end working of 200 PW's at the enclosure on Route 4, and the erection of a PW enclosure near Erlangen. Capt. Thomas reported the completion of the cemetary job at Buchenbuhle.

C Company received the two final tasks of the month. On May 31st they began the operations of a saw-mill at Buchenbuhle and the repair of a hospital in Nurnberg.
